Isaac F. Wood Satirical Medals: A Work in Progress

Isaac F. Wood was a well-known numismatist in the late 19th Century. He was instrumental in getting the American Numismatic Society back on its feet after the Civil War, and played a role in launching *The American Journal of Numismatics*.

Wood also commissioned a number of medals relating to politics, sometimes with a satirical take. Join us online on **Wednesday, May 24** when PCNS Fellow and Vice President **William Hyder** will discuss his recent research into Wood's satirical medals.

APRIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Speaker Jeff Pritchard, a retired financial planner and philanthropic advisor, provided important information about planning for the future of your collection after you're no longer around to deal with it. He started by mentioning six potential numismatic nightmares:

- Heirs sell the collection for bullion value.
- Items are spent at face value (which will likely be less than bullion value).
- Your collection may become a future hoard, if nobody knows where it is located.
- The collection ends up in the hands of someone who has no interest in or knowledge of the collection or its true value.
- Transfer may trigger unexpected Federal and/or State Estate and Gift Tax consequences.
- Home invasion, theft, or other loss.

Jeff discussed five options for the proper liquidation or transfer of your collection. He listed pros and cons of each, with lots of details to consider for each possibility. They are:

- Sell your collection during your lifetime
- Gift your collection during your lifetime
- Gift your collection through your estate

- Donating it to charity during your lifetime
- Donating it to charity through your estate

Two particularly important points Jeff mentioned were to create detailed written instructions about disposing of your collection and keeping detailed records about each purchase for potential capital gains tax purposes.
