Exhibits:

Scott Annechino shared two Peruvian half reals, both MS-66, including an 1850 and 1855 from the Lima mint.

Stephen Huston shared a rare addition to his collection, a Ptolemaic bronze of Ptolemy the First. It is a first series bronze where the name appears before an actual portrait. Ptolemy the First did not strike large bronzes as did those who followed.

David Somers brought a Connoisseur Magazine cover with a Spink & Son ad on the back from July 1914. He also shared two pages of miscellaneous tokens.

Bill Hyder exhibited new acquisitions for his collection including a S. D. Childs store card from 1898, a Patrick Moise & Klinkner store card from the 1930s, and an Elder Lincoln medal.

Michael Wehner shared a Bernhardt, Jacoby & Co. token from early 1850s? San Francisco, date disputed by various researchers.

Dan Hipple exhibited an enameled Christmas medals set and a B. Max Mehl Star Coin Book from 1932.

Federico Castillo shared an ABW Club Mexican token from Mexicali in Baja California.

Following sharing, those present enjoyed a potluck meal and an enjoyable social hour.
