PCNS Centennial Medal

The Pacific Coast Numismatic Society has announced design and ordering information for their 100th Anniversary Medal. The PCNS Centennial Medal will be engraved and struck by Daniel Carr of the Moonlight Mint in Colorado, and distributed this Fall to subscribers who pre-order by June.

The design for this historic medal revisits the PPIE commemorative designs and continues the Society's traditional octagonal logo with a new high-relief die. (Images show approved designs — not actual photos.)

Mintage will be limited to prepaid orders received by the Society by June 2015. The octagonal 41mm medal will be struck in silver, with bronzes available only as part of the 2-medal set (1 bronze + 1 one-ounce silver).

Orders with payment, \$100 per set or \$75 silver only, plus \$6 postage, must reach the Society by June at: PCNS, Box 475656, San Francisco, CA 94147.

PCNS was founded in 1915, by Farran Zerbe and a group of San Francisco collectors, during the Panama Pacific International Exposition. It was the first numismatic organization established in the western United States. PCNS then hosted the American Numismatic Association's 1915 Convention in San Francisco, in conjunction with PPIE events.
