Jettons (or jetons) are typically small, round, metallic counting pieces used in medieval times. In conjunction with counting boards, jettons functioned much like the beads on an abacus. The eternal question is: Are jettons coins? Are they tokens? Are they their own category of exonumia?

**NOVEMBER MEETING RECAP**

Jeff Pritchard gave a very interesting talk on the life and works of France's premier medalist, Jules-Clement Chaplain (1839-1909). M. Clement was venerated during his lifetime for his artistry and for being a major force in the Art Nouveau Movement, now he is largely overlooked.

Born in 1839, Chaplain enrolled in the *Ecole de Beaux Arts* as a sculptor. By 1863 he won the *Prix de Rome*, leading to formal studies in Italy. He became the official medalist of France in 1877, designing presidential medals along with the French 5-franc and 10-franc gold coins in 1895. He created a medal commemorating a visit by Tsar Nicholas and Tsarina Alexandria in 1896, widely considered his finest work.

Chaplain's period of greatest productivity coincided with loosening government control of medal production. Advancements in technology fostered greater creativity and artistic expression, while increased discretionary income fostered interest in them. Thus, more and more institutions and individuals could commission medals, and museums and medal societies were able to collect medals.

Chaplain was one of the progenitors of the Art Nouveau movement, which replaced classical

themes with more naturalistic, organic forms. Motifs included plants and insects, and the focus extended to the natural flow of such things as women's hair, clothing, and drapery. Thus, the hallmark of Chaplain's work was its simplicity, truthful portraits, and exquisite ability to capture the subject's mood, often reflected in the model's hair and clothing.

Approximately 250 examples of Chaplain medals and plaquettes are known. Jeff showed fine examples of six different phases of his work.

## NOVEMBER MEMBER EXHIBITS

**Bill Hyder** showed and talked about two medals that he is researching. We will learn more in due course.

**Michael Wehner** showed a selection of 6 Chaplain medals in his collection. Two of them were presidential medals and one was a rare porcelain medal.

**Charlie Ludwig** showed a FIDEM medal that was 100mm diameter and 22 mm thick. It was a grand prix medal and had a unique bust of an engraver with the shapes of coins emerging from the top of his head.

**Doug Ward** showed two religious medals from 1922, products of the Kissing Co., Germany. One commemorated the 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the canonization of St. Theresa. The other celebrated Pope Pius XI.

**Stephen Huston** shared a very touching WWI remembrance medal. It was created by Josue Dupon, a Belgian sculptor, and commemorated the halting of the German Army in WWI and the preservation of Western Civilization.
