Presentation by Bill Hyder: Cal Bears (not UC Berkeley Football)

Since at least the creation of the flag for the <u>1846 Bear Flag Republic</u>, the grizzly bear has been used to represent California. Bill shared images and the history of his delightful collection of badges, so-called-dollars, coins, and other exonumia that employ the grizzly bear as a device to represent the Golden State.

Bill pointed out two features of grizzly bears, long claws and a distinctive hump on their backs, which differentiate them from other types of bears.

Bill showed examples of his collection that spanned the time from the 1846 Bear Flag, used in the short-lived rebellion against Mexico by Fremont and other US citizens, to the 1948 Centennial of Sutter's discovery of gold. It was a broad range of material.

His talk also covered the life and death of an actual grizzly bear that was captured near Ventura in 1889. He was given the name "Monarch" and exploited by the SF Examiner newspaper and then housed in various SF Bay area zoos, exhibitions, and eventually museums. His image was used for several purposes that Bill delineated. One purpose was to represent the undaunted spirit of San Francisco after the great 1906 earthquake.
